About the Role

Purpose of the role

KiwiRail is in a phase of significant transformation to modernise and grow our rail and Interislander ferry services in Aotearoa, enabling the long-term success of the organisation. Underpinning this is a requirement for a strong and mature safety culture that cares for our people and protects them from harm.

Central to building this foundation is KiwiRail's Toitū Te Mauri Safety Culture Programme which is comprised of several workstreams operating in parallel to shift the dial on KiwiRail's safety performance.

KiwiRail is seeking a Senior Project Manager to deliver the workstream project plans through to completion, starting with Critical Risk Management. The role will work closely with KiwiRail's Senior Leadership Team and ensure the projects are managed successfully; they deliver on its intended benefits, adhere to quality and schedule expectations, and is seamlessly transitioned into business-as-usual.

The Senior Project Manager will be committed to keeping close control of the work while driving safety, innovation and improvement. Timely reporting of key information from each project to the overall programme and governance panels and relevant stakeholders is essential to ensuring progress of each workstream is understood.

This role is by nature flexible, with relevant experience, and effort required for projects depending on scale, complexity, and priority.

Key Accountabilities

Within the area of responsibility, this role is required to undertake the following:

Project Planning and Initiation:

- Define project scope, objectives, deliverables, and success criteria in collaboration with stakeholders.
- Develop comprehensive project plans including timelines, resource allocation, budget estimates, and risks.
- Establish governance structures and reporting mechanisms to ensure transparency and accountability.

Engagement, Communication, and Governance:

- Identify and manage relationships with internal and external stakeholders, ensuring alignment of expectations.
- Facilitate regular communication through status reports, steering committees, and stakeholder briefings.
- Act as the primary point of contact for project-related matters, resolving conflicts and negotiating trade-offs.

Execution and Delivery Management:

- Support cross-functional teams to execute project activities according to the approved plan.
- Monitor progress against milestones, adjusting plans proactively within the change control framework.
- Ensure quality assurance processes are embedded throughout the project lifecycle.

Risk, Issue, and Change Management:

- Identify potential risks or issues early and implement mitigation plans.
- Manage change requests through structured impact analysis and governance approval.
- Maintain a risk register and ensure escalation protocols are followed.

Financial and Resource Oversight:

- Track project budgets, ensuring expenditures align with forecasts and funding constraints.
- Manage third party services, including vendor selection and contract management.
- Optimize resource utilization across competing priorities and timelines.

Change Adoption and Benefits Realization

- Support business readiness and change management activities to ensure successful adoption.
- Collaborate with business units to embed project outcomes into operational processes.
- Track and report on benefits realization against original objectives.
- Conduct post-implementation reviews and lessons learned sessions to inform future projects.
