About the Role

Purpose of the role

The National Asset Manager role is a key part of the KiwiRail Infrastructure Team and is an integral part of the Engineering and Asset Management Leadership. The role will work across the Infrastructure team leading the application of best practice asset management across the rail infrastructure. The role will manage the technical inputs into the strategic, tactical and operational asset management functions of the rail infrastructure Asset Management System (AMS), with particular focus on assisting with effective asset management practices and procedures aligned to industry best practice ISO55000:2014 and the International Infrastructure Management Manual (IIMM) to ensure implementation, development and continuous improvement of KiwiRail's asset management maturity.

The role will ensure that the SAMP and AMPs are aligned with KiwiRail goals and will improve the safety and reliability of the Infrastructure assets. The role will work across all areas of the Infrastructure business unit to ensure fully integrated and sustainable outcomes from the AMPs that improve KiwiRail's asset management maturity and ensure an effective transition of the asset management improvements into business as usual.

Key Accountabilities

Within the area of responsibility, this role is required to:

- Lead the application of best practice asset management on the rail infrastructure assets
- Implement the Operational business strategy in line with the Strategic Asset Management Plan (SAMP),
- Identify lead and drive the necessary improvements need to meet the business Transformational Goals in Asset Management
- Lead the completion of the 3yr and 10yr Forward Works Programmes
- Ensure that the Asset Management Plans (technical and regional) deliver on the SAMP's objective
- Drive the execution of the Asset Management Improvement Plan to business assurance and reliability of activities associated with infrastructure assets.
- Develop and implement the Metros Network Management Plans in line with the KiwiRail Asset Management framework and the KiwiRail SAMP
