



## QUAY PARK RAIL WORKS: CONSTRUCTION

July 2026

Dear neighbour,

KiwiRail is completing its upgrade of the Auckland rail network in your area to make train travel more resilient and reliable and to prepare for the more frequent trains the City Rail Link will bring when it opens in coming months.

**Teams will work near your property during the Matariki long weekend (dates right) and will endeavour to get the work done as safely and quickly as possible.**

We will be storing material at various locations within the worksite (as marked in the map – overleaf). Traffic management will be in place as required on Tamaki Drive at the entrance to our yard and teams will access the worksite from three locations. Please exercise caution when in the area.

There will be a full Auckland rail network closure between 9 and 12 July 2026. Rail passengers are encouraged to check the AT Mobile app or visit the Auckland Transport (AT) website to plan their travel [at.govt.nz/journeyplanner](https://at.govt.nz/journeyplanner)

Thank you for your ongoing patience as we complete maintenance and upgrade works on the rail tracks near your property.

### What we are doing:

Our teams will be upgrading the rail assets around the Quay Park area. The works include installation of some underground ducts and installation of an on-tracking pad within the Auckland Rail Yard. We will undertake some associated track works at the same time.

There will also be some vehicles and machinery travelling in and out of the rail corridor.
