

Expect Trains

Whether you're driving, cycling or on foot, remember to look both ways for trains. Trains and rail maintenance vehicles always have the right of way and travel faster than they appear to. They can come at any time from either direction.

Remember:

Motorists:

- Take extreme care when aproaching a railway level crossing
- Slow down, and be prepared to stop
- · Obey the warning signs at the crossing
- If the crossing has lights which are flashing, a train is approaching, so stop your vehicle and wait for the train to pass
- If there is a 'Stop' sign, you must stop your vehicle completely
- Look both ways, up and down the tracks, to check the railway lines are clear.

Pedestrians and cyclists:

- Only cross at official crossings, or at an overpass or underpass
- Stop and look for trains both ways, up and down the tracks
- Only cross if you are sure there are no trains in sight.
