

Dear neighbour,

To prepare for future growth in south Auckland, KiwiRail is building three new railway stations between Papakura and Pukekohe. Combined with extending the electrification to Pukekohe, the new stations will make travelling by train more accessible to those living and working in the area.


Work on site has been progressing well over winter. Over the recent September partial rail closure, teams completed the installation of the platform stairs and under track pipelines. Carpentry works for the pedestrian overbridge and installation of the structural steel for the lift shaft are now underway and progressing on schedule.

What happens next?

Further structural and construction works will be carried out over the Labour Weekend full network closure, from 6am Friday 24 October – 6pm Monday 27 October.

During this time, our work hours will be 24/7.

Construction works will take place on both sides of the rail corridor. There may be noise from machinery, lights and vehicles moving around. Our staff and contractors are mindful of our rail neighbours and will work hard to minimise any disturbance, to get this essential work done as



quickly and quietly as possible. Where possible, noisier works will be scheduled to take place during the day shift. However, despite our best efforts, this work may cause you some disturbance and we apologise for the inconvenience.

There will be an increase in truck movements during working hours, please be mindful of this when travelling in the area. Please note the NZTA SH1 Papakura to Drury project is also underway and may contribute to noise and traffic congestion. Further information can be found on www.nzta.govt.nz/p2b
